Question: What are some resources you use to help you in your Bible class?

I supplement my Bible classes with these books/ideas:

1. A series of 4 books called Promise and Deliverance by DeGraaf. It is very helpful in providing extra insight and background to the many passages we are with children. It is very readable and will help you as a teacher in seeing the whole picture of God's hand in delivering His people.
2. I have several supplementary books that have crossword puzzles, artistic-type activities and fill-in-the-blank pages which provide added extensions to lessons. They are quick and easy-but not just busy work.
3. Gateway.com also is a website I often access to supplement stories and Bible memory.
4. The use of present day maps is also used to show where Biblical events actually took place. We take specific classtime to analyze where Old Testament events happened and plot the on a current map.
5. A variety of other "church" materials like: bulletin inserts for kids are wonderful for certain classes, Sunday school materials, and pastor's children sermons.
6. I keep "old" curriculum materials... because there are always ideas that can be used effectively in another curriculum.
