REVISED CURRICULUM DESCRIPTION: GRADE 2

The grade 2 curriculum will emphasize the New Testament. The featured epistle is James.

Students will begin the year with a brief overview of the Old Testament. These lessons will emphasize God's promise of a Messiah. Students will be introduced to material on the time between the Old Testament and the New Testament and will see that these years were important in God's preparation for the coming Messiah.

In their study of the New Testament, students will trace how Jesus revealed himself as God's promised Messiah. They will study the events of Passion Week, Jesus' crucifixion, and the resurrection.

The curriculum concludes with a study of how Jesus' followers responded to their salvation in Christ. Students will be challenged to respond faithfully, like Peter and Paul, to Christ's saving work.
