## **Captain Planet Grants**

Educators, both K-12 classroom and informal, who are interested in receiving support for students to design and implement hands-on environmental solutions are eligible for project funding.

- Project must be based in the U.S., be solution-oriented, be project-based, and be youth-led.
- Result in demonstrable environmental outcomes
- Application Window: July 16th-July 15th

ecoTech Grants:

- Project must be based in the U.S., integrate the use of technology to address environmental problem, be project-based and be youth-led.
- Result in demonstrable environmental outcomes
- Application Window: July 16th-July 15th
