Dear Friend of CSI,

As I began to write this year's opening letter, I reflected on last year's letter and saw what I wrote about trials and their role in refining us as followers of Christ. Little did I know when I wrote that article that six months later, I would have a heart attack and a subsequent stroke and be faced with the health challenges that resulted from those two events.

As I shared with the CSI Board at our last meeting, having just returned from three months of disability time and therapy, these events really shake your confidence in your human abilities. Public speaking, which used to come easily to me, was now something I didn't relish quite as much, as one of the side effects of the stroke was some difficulties in word finding and memory. Thankfully, we are "fearfully and wonderfully made" by our Creator, and my brain has continued to heal and rewire itself to work around the damaged areas.

All that being said, I find myself back on the job, and reflecting on this year fills me with excitement and appreciation. Membership continues to grow, as schools recognize the tremendous value and support our accreditation/school improvement program provides (see page 5). We continue to refine and improve the accreditation protocols and believe our program provides an excellent service to our schools. We are equally committed to provide excellent professional development (PD) for our faculty (see page 8). This past February, our second iteration of the CSI Bible Instruction Symposium was held at the Museum of the Bible in Washington, DC and continues to receive rave reviews from participants. Our goal is to continue to provide PD for our member schools' Bible faculty, giving them access to leading biblical scholars and curriculum tools that will



transform their teaching and delivery methods. We have received feedback from participants that the Symposium helped them completely transform their schools' Bible education at all levels. Our Christian School Educators Science Academy (CESA) completed its third year of operations and continues to grow and bear fruit as well, changing the way science is taught from a biblical perspective in our schools. CSI is committed to refine and improve both of these PD opportunities in the future.


CSI continues to provide the finest practicum-based leadership development that exists for school leaders, from emerging leaders in our Educational Leader Development Institute (ELDI) to seasoned leaders in our Principal Development Institute (PDI). Both programs are experiencing full classes (24 for ELDI and 16 for PDI) with waiting lists, very favorable reviews, and our output is better prepared administrators. We are excited to announce an official partnership with the Van Lunen Institute as the provider for our capstone leadership program. The Van Lunen Fellows program is designed for senior leaders of larger school systems. This partnership will

ensure leaders at CSI member schools are able to attend this excellent program and keep improving their schools.



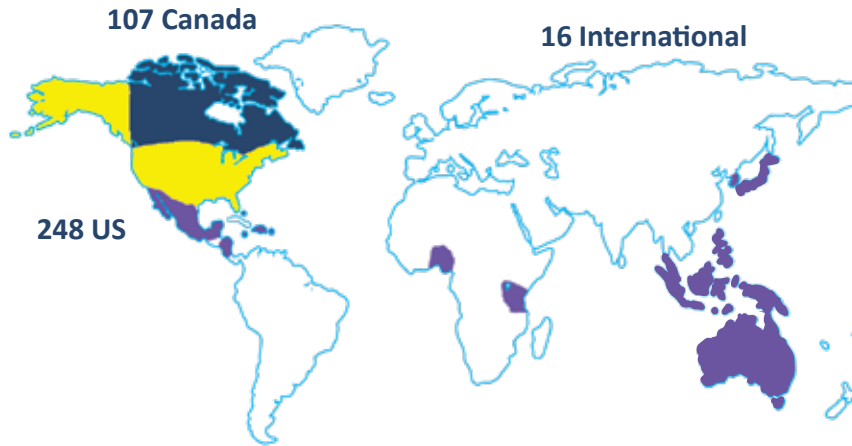

CSI ACCREDITATION: A RESOURCE FOR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

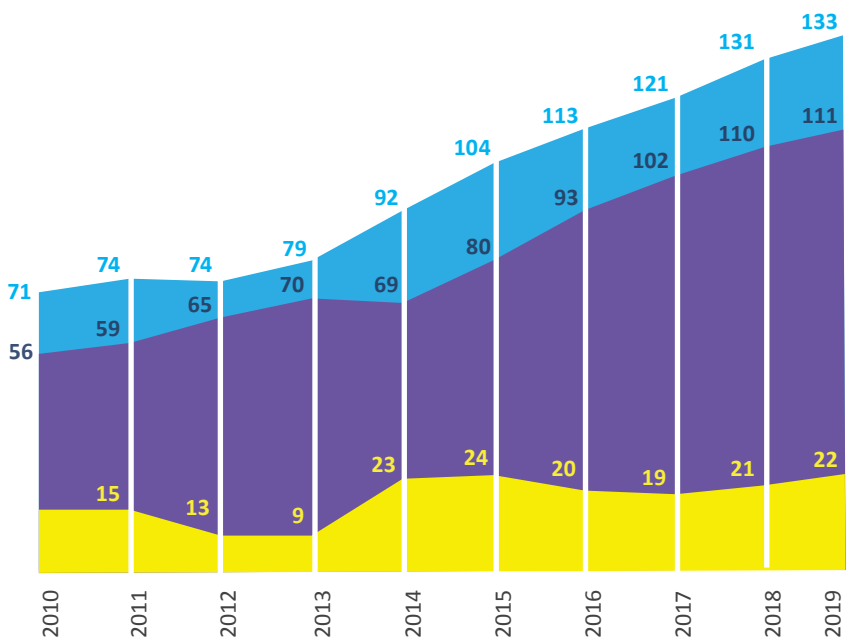

Our accreditation process, grounded in a reformed transformational worldview, is focused on a continual school improvement process, allowing CSI to support schools in their journeys toward excellence in implementing their Christian missions. Over the past years, we have intentionally moved from a tool that could be viewed more as an evaluative checklist for schools to a school improvement process that is now genuinely focused on reflective self study, collaborative relationship, and the development of targeted, dynamic school improvement plans.

As CSI’s Director of School Improvement, Sheryl Jo is honored to read the school improvement plans that are established through the accreditation process. “It is an engaging and thought-provoking experience to read the improvement goals that originate from a school’s self study and from collaborative time schools spent with the accreditation site visit team. Our Christian schools, regardless of size, location, or model, celebrate many of the same joys and share many of the same struggles. I see the potential for great power in that and a call for future action to support one another in our shared missions.”

Jeff Droog, superintendent of Mount Vernon Christian School and current Chair of the CSI Accreditation Commission, which meets annually each July to approve all school accreditations, shared about the accreditation process. “In reading through the Commission accreditation reports each July, I am always so appreciative of the quality of Christian education nationwide. Curriculum & Instruction Hosts Three Successful Events for Teachers and Students

CSESA

The third annual Christian School Educators Science Academy (CSESA) kicked off in Grand Rapids, Michigan on November 15, 2018. The Academy, which gathered forty-one passionate and gifted science teachers, along with six lead teachers, who were able to spend two days immersing themselves in an inquiry-based model of science instruction from a biblical worldview.

Over the course of the two days teachers were encouraged to interact with the model from the viewpoint of the student, among other things participating in a structured inquiry lab with *Daphnia* and an engineering lab where they were tasked to “Save the City.” The Van Andel Education Institute (VAEI) staff along with Susan Koppendrayer, CSI STEM education specialist, and Ken Bergwerff, CSI worldview facilitator, presented each step of the process as an opportunity to share God’s story with students without compromising high quality science teaching and learning.



Bible Instruction Symposium

The Curriculum and Instruction team at CSI was thrilled to host another outstanding group of Bible educators in Washington, DC on February 13–15, 2019. The 2019 CSI Bible Instruction Symposium was a rich time of networking and learning for all who attended but especially for the thirty teachers to be reaffirmed in their profession, share ideas and resources with one another, bring up specific concerns happening in their classrooms and schools, and learn from scholars and peers.

CSI Bible Specialist Heidi Dean kicked off the training with a presentation on contextualizing the gospel, or improving our communication of the gospel. Each

grade level track—elementary, middle, and high school—was then divided into groups of ten, where they dove into subject matter content pertinent to their grade level. The grade level sessions were led first from the perspective of a seminary professor and then from a lead teacher, who presented examples of how these ideas were presented in their classrooms. The small size of the groups was ideal for participants, who were able to bond quickly and share resources, as well as discuss ideas both past and present that they have gleaned over their careers.

CSI Bible Quiz Challenge

The Bible Quiz Challenge was established to celebrate Christian education and the excellent Bible instruction that our CSI member school students receive. The event was hosted by Christian Schools International and supported by the NIV Kids' Quiz Bible and Zonderkidz. The challenge ran throughout the 2018–2019 school year and included a local competition, a regional competition, and a North American competition.

A total of 58 schools representing 107, third and fourth grade classrooms registered for the local competitions. From there, 38 students advanced to the regional competition, and after the regional tests were scored, five finalists remained who were excited to compete in the North American competition. Luke Landis, Caden LeMahieu, Levi Little, Justin McKendrick, and Andrew Peter gathered in Washington, DC on Thursday, June 20, 2019 at the Museum of the Bible.



During the final round of competition, the students raced throughout the museum to answer as many questions as they could in one hour. The questions were taken from the NIV Kids' Quiz Bible and tied in with artifacts throughout the museum. Afterward, a reception was held with family and friends to celebrate each child for their hard work and the importance they placed on memorizing and learning the Holy Scriptures.

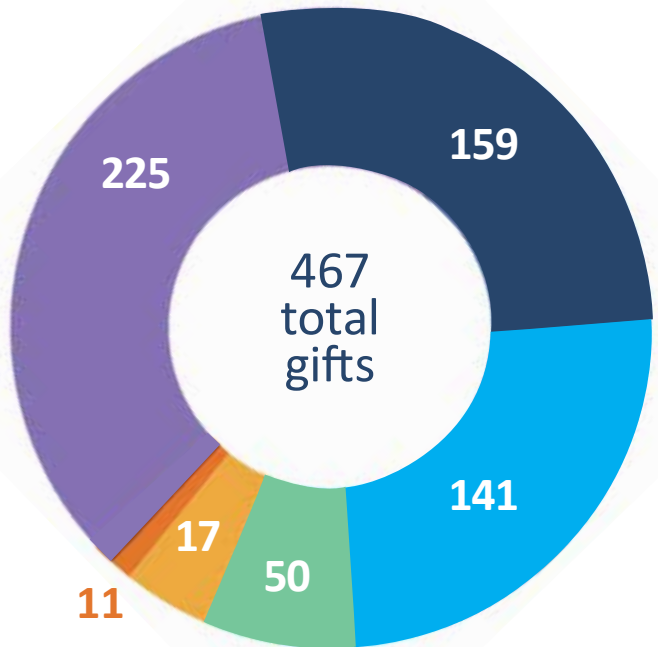
